### Leave A Message

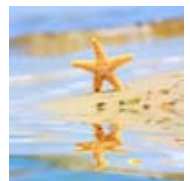

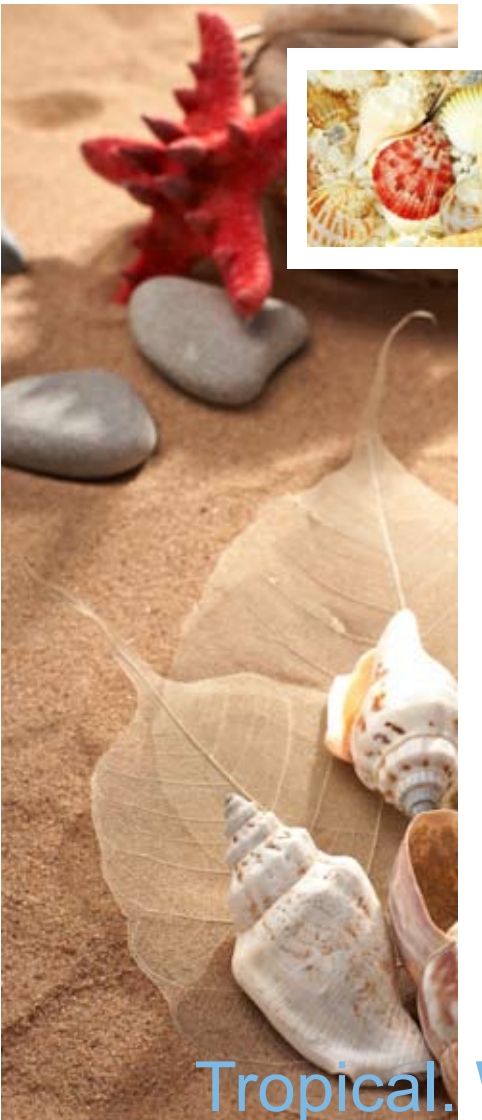

## Green Living Tip

According to a Danish study of allergens, after nickel, fragrances were the second most common cause of allergic contact dermatitis, which is inflamed skin. Over the last decade, fragrance sensitivities in dermatitis patients have increased up to 13 percent. These substances can also cause allergic reactions when inhaled. If you are sensitive to these substances, you can help alleviate your exposure. Experts recommend looking for fragrance-free products, double-rinsing all detergents, avoiding fabric softeners, and avoiding perfumes, colognes, aftershaves, fingernail-care products, and hairspray.

## Summer Milkshake Recipes

### Red, White & Blue Milk Shakes

- 1 quart strawberry ice cream
- 1 cup milk
- 1/2 cup strawberry preserves
- 1/4 cup frozen whipped topping, thawed
- 1/4 cup fresh blueberries, washed

Combine the ice cream, milk, and strawberry preserves in a blender. Blend until well combined. Pour into glasses, top with whipped topping and blueberries.

### Mocha Mudslide Milkshake

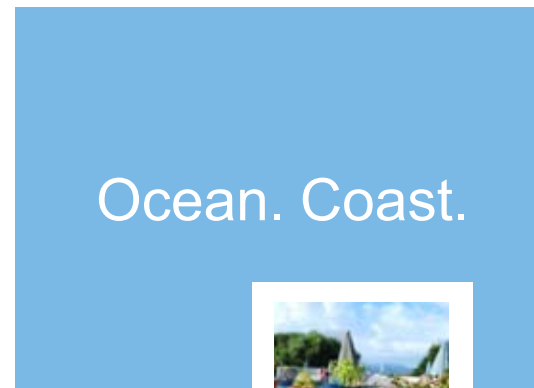
- 1 cup milk
- 2/3 cup sliced ripe bananas
- 2 Tbsp sugar
- 1 tsp instant coffee
- 1/4 cup vanilla low-fat yogurt

Place the milk, banana, sugar and coffee granules in a blender and blend until well combined. Freeze in a blender container for 1 hour or until slightly frozen. Loosen frozen mixture from the sides of blender container, add yogurt and blend until smooth. Garnish with banana slices.

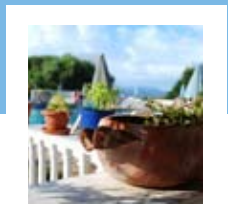
## River Trivia

- The longest river in the world is the Nile River in Africa, followed by the Amazon in South America.
- The world's shortest river is the Roe River, which flows between Giant Springs and the Missouri River near Great Falls, Montana, and is only 200 feet (61 meters) long.
- The Salto Angel Waterfall on the upper tributary of the Rio Caroni in Canaima National Park in Venezuela, is the highest waterfall in the world at 3212 feet (979 meters).
- The waterfall with the largest volume is Inga Falls on the Congo River in Africa.
- The Darling River in Australia is that continent's longest river and is mostly dry in the winter.
- More than 30 bridges span the Seine River which flows through the heart of Paris.
- The muddiest river in the world is the Hwang Ho in China.
- Recently, divers discovered the world's longest underground river, twisting and turning for 95 miles (153 kilometers) through limestone caverns on Mexico's Yucatan Peninsula.
